

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE

Crawfordjohn Public Hall, Manse Road, Crawfordjohn ML12 6SR

Crawfordjohn is conveniently situated less than 4 miles from the Motorway along a quiet road.

From the South - M6 & M74 (M)

Leave the A74(M) at junction 13 (Abington Services) onto the B7078 and at the roundabout go straight on following signs for Douglas and Crawfordjohn. (NOTE: do not take the first unclassified road to Crawfordjohn). As you enter Crawfordjohn on the B740 just past the 30mph signs turn left and continue to the end of the road, then turn left and take 1st right into venue car park.

From the North - M74

Leave the M74 at junction 13 (Abington Services) and follow signs from Glasgow M74 and then follow B7078 and B740 to cross the motorway and at the roundabout take the B7078 signed Douglas and Crawfordjohn. As you enter Crawfordjohn on the B740 just past the 30mph signs turn left and continue to the end of the road, then turn left and take 1st right into venue car park.

JUDGES PROFILES

PENNY C. FREDERIKSEN

AMBRICAN

My introduction to Basset Hounds was the puppy my mother, Audrey Charman, bought in 1964 from the Fredwell Kennels. Two years later, she acquired her first show dog from Peggy Keevil's famous Grims Kennels, and thus began the start of our involvement in showing, breeding and judging. That first show dog sired my foundation bitch who was born in 1970, and she accompanied me to Canada when I left home. For the ten years that I lived in Canada, my hounds were registered under the Charford prefix, which my mother and I had shared in the U.K. With my marriage to Randy and a move to the United States, we began breeding our Basset Hounds under the **AMBRICAN** prefix in 1984. Together we have bred many champions from a limited number of litters, our most famous being the 1990 Nationals BIS winner Am/Can.Ch. Ambrican Lipizzan, ROM, and BIS Am/Can.Ch. Ambrican Ivan, both of whom are direct descendants of my first Basset. Lipizzan and Ivan are themselves in the pedigrees of our current hounds.

After my first judging appointment in April 1975 at the Coulsdon KC Open Show, I have judged hounds at many matches in both Canada and the U.S. as well as Bassets at several open shows in England on various trips home. I first awarded challenge certificates at Bath Championship Show in 1996, and judged bitches at the BHC's Championship Show in June 2002. I have also judged the BHC of Canada's Specialty Show in 2008 and the BHCA's National Sweepstakes in 2015.

I have been an on-going Basset Hound Club member from the start of my involvement in Bassets as well as a member of the BHCA since 1976 and have held memberships in local breed clubs and several all-breed clubs. My professional training as an Administrative Assistant in both the university and corporate worlds has stood me in good stead within the dog world too! As a member of the BHC of Canada during my years there, I served as Secretary, Newsletter Editor and President. I am currently the Secretary of the BHC of Greater San Antonio and I have also served on the BHCA Judges' Education Committee.

Thank you for inviting me to judge your show this year – it is a privilege and honour.

Frank is one of our Top Scottish Judges and awards CC in most of the Gundogs breeds. As a breeder he has produced many Champions over several of the gundog breeds and is still very active breeding and showing alongside an extensive judging career which has taken him all over the world. He is currently campaigning a Top Winning Flatcoat Retriever puppy. He has judged hounds at Open Show level for many years and is on many of the judging list for hound breeds including Basset Hounds. He has owned shown and bred Rhodesian Ridgebacks from the early 2000's and has made up a Champion as well as several other winners and awards CC in this breed. We are delighted to have him come judge our Special Awards Classes and hope you give him plenty of support.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present at any time during the Show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the K.C. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
