

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE

Crawfordjohn Public Hall, Manse Road, Crawfordjohn ML12 6SR

Crawfordjohn is conveniently situated less than 4 miles from the Motorway along a quiet road.

From the South - M6 & M74 (M)

Leave the A74(M) at junction 13 (Abington Services) onto the B7078 and at the roundabout go straight on following signs for Douglas and Crawfordjohn. (NOTE: do not take the first unclassified road to Crawfordjohn). As you enter Crawfordjohn on the B740 just past the 30mph signs turn left and continue to the end of the road, then turn left and take 1st right into venue car park.

From the North - M74

Leave the M74 at junction 13 (Abington Services) and follow signs from Glasgow M74 and then follow B7078 and B740 to cross the motorway and at the roundabout take the B7078 signed Douglas and Crawfordjohn. As you enter Crawfordjohn on the B740 just past the 30mph signs turn left and continue to the end of the road, then turn left and take 1st right into venue car park.

Special Awards Classes

Mrs Nicky Beale (Woferlow)

Started handling in Junior Handling classes 40 years ago with her mother's English Setters before being asked to handle other breeds. When her mother added in German Short Haired Pointers Nicky continued to travel all over to show for her mum. After marriage and her own two boys were born she realised she missed the shows and following a family decision they bought their first basset fifteen years ago and her love affair with the breed began. Currently she is showing a champion male and also serves on the Basset Hound Club committee. This will be her first judging appointment in Scotland although she has judged elsewhere in the UK including a Club Show. She is enjoying building up her experience and knowledge of the breed. REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.

(a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.

(b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.

2. a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present at any time during the Show.

b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-

(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

(b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.

(c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the K.C. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her

office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint
