

19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
20. Dog Fouling: Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog/s at any Kennel Club licenced venue and the environs of that event including car parks and caravan parks and approaches. Anyone failing to clean up will be reported to the committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from the exhibitor at future shows.
21. Should any judge be unable to fulfil their engagement the Committee reserves the right to appoint another in their place. In these circumstances exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition, but no entry fees will be returned.
22. Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
23. The Committee reserve to itself the right to refuse on reasonable grounds any entries that it may think fit to.
24. The Committee will not be responsible for any damage or loss to any of the dogs or to property, by any act or omission of themselves or their agents.
25. In all cases the Judges decision is final, except where fraud, misrepresentation or a breach of Kennel Club Rules is discovered, or a bona fide mistake is made by the judge.
26. No animal other a dog duly entered for the Show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance.
27. All Rules, Regulations and Definitions of the nature of Rules & Regulations printed for convenience in other parts of this Schedule shall be deemed to have the sane effect as these Regulations.
28. All dogs must be solely and unconditionally the property of the exhibitors in whose names they are entered and must only be entered under such names as granted by the Kennel Club. NB a name MUST be GIVEN.
29. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF ENTRIES: Entries will only be acknowledged if a stamped, addressed envelope/postcard is enclosed with entries.
30. SHOW ENTRIES/ BANK CHARGES: Exhibitors attention is drawn to the Kennel Club announcement that Bank Charges incurred by the Society through incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheques in respect of their entries will be passed on to the exhibitors concerned and failure to pay entry fees and bank charges will result in the exhibitor being dealt with by the Kennel Club Committee.
31. PARENTS WILL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ACTIONS OF THEIR CHILDREN and ADULTS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY CHILD THEY HAVE BROUGHT TO THE SHOW.
32. Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
33. BANK CHARGES: A CHARGE WILL BE MADE FOR DISHONURED CHEQUES.

GANGWAYS: As per K.C. Regulations (in order to comply with Fire Regulations) all EXITS and GANGWAYS TO BE KEPT ABSOLUTELY CLEAR AT ALL TIMES.

The Junior Warrant Competition – Qualifying Heat.

Judge Dave Chapman (Kitsune)

Eligibility to compete:

All dogs which have received a junior warrant between the qualifying period
1st June 2018 and 31st May 2019.

Dogs may be entered in all qualifying heats. Once qualified exhibitors will be required to withdraw the qualified dog from any subsequent junior warrant qualifying heat(s). The refund of entry fees is at the discretion of the organising society.

Four dogs and two reserves will be selected and subsequently invited to the semi-finals in London
in October 2019, with the final being held at Crufts 2020.

Eligible dogs do not need to be entered for the open show in order to compete in the junior warrant competition qualifier. Although entries must be made prior to this shows closing date and be accompanied with the relevant entry fee.

The maximum number of dogs for the qualifying heat is 64. It is likely that this number will be exceeded acceptance of entries will be on a first come first served basis.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.

(a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.

(b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.

2. a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present at any time during the Show.

b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-

(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

(b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.

(c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the K.C. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging: 9.30 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees: Non-Members, First Entry £4.00, all subsequent entries with same Dog £1.50, Handling £1.50, Not For Competition £1.50 per Dog, CATALOGUES: £3.50 prepaid (£4.00 on the day). Prepaid catalogues to be collected by 12 noon). Membership: £3.50 Single, £6.00 Joint, £2.50 Junior, £8.00 Family (2 adults & 2 children (under 18) residing at same address). Advertising: £10.00 Full Page, £6.00 Half Page
6. PRIZE MONEY: there will be no prize money paid at the show With the exception of Stakes Classes
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. BEST PUPPY IN SHOW: Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best in Group or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best in Group and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from:
a) Those puppies declared Best Puppy in Breed.
b) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
c) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each group or on each day.
Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners.
11. BEST IN SHOW The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register. Shows Judged on the Group System (Definition; Shows judged on the Group System includes classes for breeds within more than one group, as defined in Kennel Club Regulation B(A); and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show.) Best of Breed: Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.
Best of Group: Best of group and subsequent placings must be selected from:-
a) The Best of Breed winners in each group
b) The Best dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
c) The Best dog from Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each Group or on each day.
Best in Show: Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. A DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events. When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. continued
