### *From the North (Glasgow, Paisley, M8)*

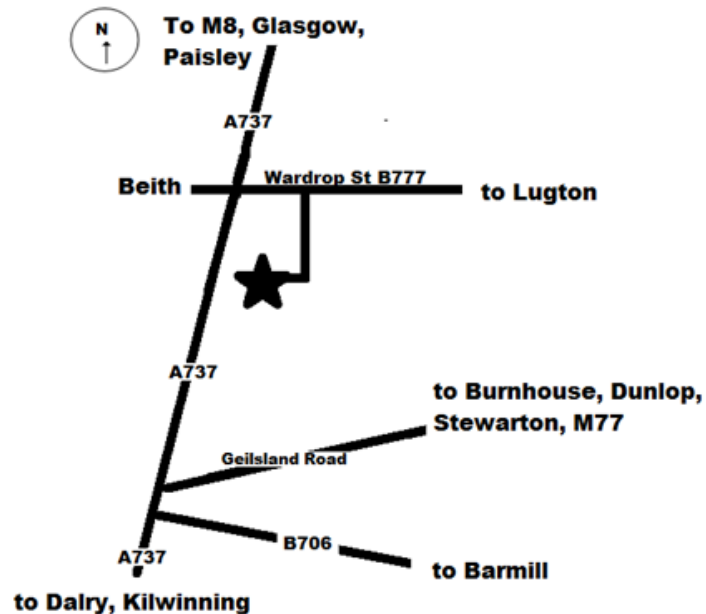
Follow the A737 till you reach the crossing with the B777 (Wardrop Street) Turn left here and take the next right into the estate.

**Lesley McNaughton (Cedavoch)** first awarded CCs in Dachshunds in 1992 and has judged all 6 varieties in UK and abroad. Has judged at Crufts on 2 occasions and will be judging the MWHHD Dachshunds there in 2020. Has judged all the hounds, other groups and BIS at open show level.

**Andrew D. Stewart(Ingerdorm)** grew up with Irish Terriers and started lightly showing them in the 90s before starting to show Affenpinschers and now awards CCs in 8 breeds.

**Michael Boulcott (Ingerdorm)** Has been judging since the late 70s and along side his wife Margaret and Andrew Stewart has made up over 20 champions in the UK, Ireland & Internation and 1 world champion

**Mrs Ellen O'Neill** has been involved with dogs for over 25 years and has made up both UK and Irish Champions. She began judging in 2000 and awards CCs in Akitas.

**Brian Beaton (Kettlehills)** got his first Irish Setter in 1984 and began showing in 1997 and has been judging since 2007 having judged the gundog group at limited show level.

**Mrs K McMurray (Merryoth)** co-owns a St Bernard with her mother in law and has been awarding CCs in CKCS since 1998 in numerous countries and will be judging dogs at Crufts 2020.

**C Everard (Stagwire)** Has been showing Wire Fox Terriers since childhood.

**Rickie Robertson (Quothieuan)** Got his first beardedie in 1980 and has judged a few open shows and beardedie club primary.

**Ms Donna Williamson (Dawnryan)** has had Goldens since 1982, showing since 1987, and has judged at Companion and Open show level.

**Judy Ralston (Scotach)** Has competed with her borzois in breed and handling classes throughout the years and won a CC at Crufts.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The Show will open at 9.30a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 10 a.m.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- ENTRY FEES: £4.00 First Dog; subsequent entries with same dog £1.00.
- PRIZE MONEY: Stakes Classes only
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- BEST PUPPY IN SHOW: There is no Best Puppy in Show competition. Special Best Puppy in Show will come from the Special Puppy classes in each group.
- BEST IN SHOW  
The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.  
Shows Judged on the Group System (Definition; Shows judged on the Group System includes classes for breeds within more than one group, as defined in Kennel Club Regulation B(A); and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show.)  
Best of Breed: Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.  
Best of Group: Best of group and subsequent placings must be selected from:-  
a) The Best of Breed winners in each group  
b) The Best dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.  
c) The Best dog from Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each Group or on each day.  
Best in Show: Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
- Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- A DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.  
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.  
When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.  
The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.  
Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.  
When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.  
Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.  
Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.  
**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
- Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
- No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
