RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.15a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time from 9.15am, but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **ENTRY FEES:** £4.50 First Entry Per Dog; £1.50 subsequent entries with same dog . **MEMBERSHIP:** Single £5.00; Joint £7.00. **CATALOGUES:** Prepaid £2.50. Enter 3 dogs for a free Catalogue.
7. **PRIZE MONEY:** Prize money will only be paid as detailed on the cover of this schedule.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended.(Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information)Best Puppy in Show. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes and Best Puppy in Breed, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may be subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from AV Classes when judged before breed classes. Proviso For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **BEST IN SHOW:** From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended.(Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information) The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. **BEST OF BREED:** Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be selected from which the Best of Breed must be declared. **BEST OF GROUP:** Best of Group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from:- (a) The Best of Breed winners in each Group provided they are unbeaten winning dogs. (b) The Best unbeaten winning dog from Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each Group or on each day. **BEST IN SHOW:** Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners provided they are unbeaten. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show. **WITHDRAWAL FROM OTHER COMPETITION:** Dogs which become eligible for Best of Group and Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best of Group and Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best of Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. **PROVISO:** For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Group or Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
16. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

17. All dogs resident outside the U.K. must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
18. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - o When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - o If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - o The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - o Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
19. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered.
20. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
21. All entries must be made on or before **MONDAY 11TH SEPTEMBER 2017** (1st Class Postmark), upon form enclosed for that purpose and available online at www.printmatter.info.
22. The Club will refuse all entries unless full payment is received and HONoured. If cheques are not honoured and re-presented the resultant BANK CHARGES will be passed onto the exhibitor as part of the final entry fee.
23. The entry fee of a dog entered and not exhibited will be forfeited.
24. The DOG COMMITTEE will not be in any way responsible for any claim for injury or compensation occasioned by or arising out of the holding of the show, or by reason of the act of any person in attendance of present therat.
25. No animal other than a dog duly entered at the show will be allowed in the precincts of the dog show during its continuance with the exception of Registered Guide Dogs or Hearing Dogs for the Deaf.
26. A Grooming Area will be provided for the convenience of Exhibitors desiring to clean and prepare their dogs for exhibition, and no Exhibitor will be permitted to clean and prepare their dogs for exhibition anywhere else.
27. Should any of the judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagements, the committee reserve to themselves the right of appointing other judges to act. Exhibitors will, in that case, be at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned.
28. The order in which the breeds are entered in the Schedule is not necessarily the judging order. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be on time for their classes.
29. The trophy winners, on receipt of their awards, shall sign an undertaking to return the trophy in time for the next show and are liable for any damage to or loss while it is in their keeping.
30. Should any question arise which is not provided for in these Regulations, the decision of the Committee shall be final, subject to appeal to the Kennel Club.
31. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog/s at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including the car park and approaches. Anyone failing to clear up will be reported to the Committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from that exhibitor for future shows.
33. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, included its environs, car park and approaches.
34. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a(registered as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
35. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
