

## REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.
  - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
  - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
    - 2.a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present at any time during the Show.
    - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
  - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
  - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
  - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the K.C. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## WEIGHING OF MINIATURE DACHSHUNDS

### Health and Welfare Statement

Miniature Dachshunds will be weighed at all Scottish Dachshund Club shows. The desired maximum weight of Miniature Dachshunds is 11 lb's.

The Committee wishes to make it clear to exhibitors that the health and welfare of all dogs entered at The Scottish Dachshunds Club events is of the highest importance.

The Animal Welfare Act became law on 6th April 2007. The focus is now on the responsibility of the owner, as seen in the "Duty of Care". Those who own a dog are legally responsible for its welfare, otherwise they may be found to be committing a "Welfare Offence".

The committee may take action against any exhibitors who are found to be depriving their dogs of water and/or food in order to meet the desired maximum weight requirement for miniatures in the Breed Standard.

Exhibits which appear thin and undernourished should be seriously penalised by judges.



### Kennel Club Breeders' Competition 2010

#### The Breeders' Competition offers the following Awards:

##### Best Breeder in Breed

##### Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes

##### Best Breeder in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th.

##### Grand Final at DFS Crufts 2011

#### The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must comprise four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows::

Breed win 1 point  
Win in AVNSC Classes 1 point  
Fourth in Group 1 point  
Third in Group 2 points  
Second in Group 3 points  
First in Group 4 points

The thirty Breeders who have amassed the highest number of points over a calendar year will qualify for the DFS Crufts Final in the following year. At the end of the competition year in question, Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club which will advise whether they have qualified for the DFS Crufts Final.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.30 a.m.
  2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
  3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m.
  4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
  5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
  6. **ENTRY FEES:** Members with C.C.s: 1st entry per dog £10.00; Members without C.C.'s £5.00 per dog, 2nd and subsequent entries per dog £1.00  
Non-Members with C.C.s: 1st entry per dog £12.00; without C.C.'s £6.00 per dog, 2nd and subsequent entries per dog £1.00  
**VETERAN:** £5.00 if entering straight into this Class. **NOT FOR COMPETITION & COMPLIMENTARY:** £5.00 per dog. **CATALOGUES:** £2.50 with entry (£3.00 on day of Show).
  7. **PRIZE MONEY:** Open Stakes, Veronica Collins Memorial Stakes and Members Open Stakes Only: 1st £5.00; 2nd £4.00; 3rd £3.00; 4th £2.00; 5th £1.00.
  8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
  9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
  10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
  11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best of Group and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. **WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION:** Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. **PROVISO:** For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
  12. **BEST IN SHOW:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from dogs beaten only by the dog declared Best in Show. **WITHDRAWAL FROM OTHER COMPETITION:** Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. **PROVISO:** For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
  13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
  14. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
  15. All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
  16. All dogs resident outside the U.K. must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
  17. **DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
    - o When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
    - o If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
    - o The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
    - o Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
    - o When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
    - o Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
    - o Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.  
**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
- Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
18. Not for Competition: Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
